



# The Silver Cheetahs Win 19 Medals

The Silver Cheetahs was founded in 1991 by Ed Jinks and Jerome White to groom youth to their full athletic potential within the sport of Track & Field. It is the intention of the founders to give athletes the best opportunities available for higher education in addition to their academic performance. The athletes compete within the Amateur Athletic Union, traveling to locations as far north as Detroit, Michigan and as far west as Des Moines, Iowa. The Savannah-Chatham Silver Cheetahs also host a county-wide youth invitational track & field meet to expose the community at large to the sport of track and field. This year's event was held on Saturday, July 12 at Savannah State University's Stadium.

The Silver Cheetahs compete year-round in Cross-Country during the Fall, Indoor Track & Field during the Winter and Outdoor Track & Field during the Spring and

Summer months. You can find them practicing at Savannah State University, running faster, throwing farther and jumping higher, grooming the next Cheetah Champions.

The team has done an awesome job medaling amongst the best in the nation. With a total of 19 medals earned over the eight (8) day competition, the Silver Cheetahs clearly made their presence felt! The Cheetahs earned two Gold medals, three Silver medals, five Bronze medals, and nine Copper medals (4th through 8th place). Included in the results is the new National Record for the Sub-Youth Boys Long Jump of 20 feet, 6.75 inches set by Mike Dash. Last year the Cheetahs returned home with 17 medals. This year they broke that record returning home with nineteen (19). Every Cheetah is a Champion and we are so proud of each and every one of them.

## Georgia to Host 37th Annual Conference of EANGUS

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS), representing more than 414,000 National Guard enlisted Soldiers and Airmen, their families and retirees will hold its 37th Annual Conference on August 18-21, 2008 at the Savannah Trade and International Center in Savannah, GA. More than 1500 National Guard members and families are expected to attend the EANGUS conference on Georgia's historic coast.

The conference will discuss a wide variety of topics and identify specific legislative issues important to Association members that will be brought before Congress during the 2009 Congressional year.

Adjutants general from 54 states and territories and National Guard Bureau leaders are expected to be in attendance. Awards will be presented to the Outstanding National Guard Soldiers and Airmen of the Year as well as to civilian employers who have shown outstanding support to employees in the National Guard.

EANGUS is organized to pursue mutual goals of the National Guard and the national defense. Through the "We Care for America Foundation" program, members have donated more than \$300,000 in grants to Guard members and their families since Hurricane Katrina. Additionally, EANGUS has supported the families of more than 300,000 Guardsmen deployed for the Global War on Terrorism.
