SSU Starts Football Camp

Savannah State began its 2009 football camp on August 3. Head coach Robby Wells addressed the team that same night and tabbed this season's theme as "All Out All In". Wells stated the meaning behind the theme was "I want an all out effort from everyone and everyone has to be all in when it comes to what we're doing. We have to be together." 85 players reported to camp with the wide receiver Antonio Proctor (5'4") and defensive back Brent McCall (149-lbs.) being the smallest while offensive linemen Jonathan Clowers (6'6") and Jared Brunson (332-lbs.) being the largest.

The Rams defense returns eight starters to a team that led the conference in fewest points and yards allowed. The offense lost coordinator Donald Pittman to Fort Valley State in the off-season but do return quarterback Kisan Flakes who threw for 1,198 yards and 13 touchdowns. The ASU ground game led the league in rushing. The Rams begin the season August 27 on the road at Chowan.
